

Eagle Rock Music Festival

Los Angeles City Councilmember Jose Huizar and *Center for the Arts, Eagle Rock* will present the **Tenth Annual Eagle Rock Music Festival**; the yearly free community street music festival on *Colorado Boulevard* in Eagle Rock.

Saturday, October 4, 2008

5p.m. – Midnight

The annual festival will welcome an eclectic, multicultural, and local to Los Angeles lineup, treating Angelenos of all ages and backgrounds to a free music experience that goes beyond genre-specific boundaries.

Musicians will perform in venues ranging from tire shops to coffee shops along Colorado Boulevard, which will be open to pedestrians between Eagle Rock Boulevard and Argus Street. The two outdoor Global and Emerging main stages will return to the block to bring innovative music to a diverse, all-ages crowd; the Global stage will be curated by Northeast L.A.- based collective Dublab, and artists currently scheduled for the Emerging stage include Eagle Rock-based Earlimart, IMA Robot side project Edward Sharpe and the Magnetic Zeroes, and the punky ladies of Mika Miko.

More than 30 artists will also perform in festival showcases, including a hip-hop stage by Fidel Rodriguez of KPFK's Divine Forces Radio; an indie stage hosted by the Eagle Rock-based The Ship Recording Studio; an Experimental stage at the American Legion Hall; Latin influenced hard rock with Aztlan Underground and Ollin at the Zocaloc stage; big band swing and Daddy Cool (the Australian band best known for their 1971 hit song "Eagle Rock") at the historic Craftsman Women's 20th Century Club; and kids' programming is at Eagle Rock's "City Hall".
