

Add chamber calendars to your Google Calendar

From YOUR Google calendar: on the left hand column, near the bottom, you will see “Other calendars”. Click the dropdown button and select “Add by URL”. Then copy and paste one of the following URLs depending on your preference. Then “Add Calendar”. Repeat for any of the other calendars you wish to subscribe to.
